Project Spotlights

While in Rwanda we visited several of INSPIRE!africa's sponsor projects. Two of these projects include the work being done through the wellness center in Cyangugu and livestock donations to survivors and their families. Below you can read about our visits to the Wellness Center and to Alphonsine, a widow who received a cow from INSPIRE!africa.

The Cyangugu Wellness Centre

We visited the Cyangugu Wellness Centre on southern Lake Kivu. INSPIRE!africa has been supporting this Centre for widows since it began 2 years ago. The goals of the Wellness Centre are to change the lives of widows and their children by building capacity for income generation as well as providing trauma counseling and other basics of life.

We visited a group who were receiving sewing lessons with the machines INSPIRE!africa donated 2 years ago. With this skill the students will be able to form a cooperative, receive a loan for a sewing machine to share and build a small business. This will change their lives forever.

We also visited a cooperative of 12 survivors who met through the Wellness Centre. With the training, trauma counseling and hygiene kits donated by INSPIRE!africa, they now have a very successful business buying and selling cows. They thanked INSPIRE!africa for all we had done to give them the strength and confidence to be successful.

Livestock for Widows: A Very Special Cow Donation

One rainy day we had the pleasure of meeting Alphonsine, a widow who had received a cow last year from INSPIRE!africa. All 6 of her children and her husband were killed at the Nyamata church during the genocide. She survived, only because she was taken from the church by Interhamwe soldiers and gang raped every day for a number of days. As a result, she is now HIV+.

She told us how the cow provides her companionship and keeps her busy so she doesn't think about the family she lost. She doesn't cry anymore and that is why she named the cow Comfort.

Her crops are now doing much better because she can use the manure for fertilizer. She uses the profits from the sale of the milk to feed herself and buy grain for Comfort.

Comfort recently produced a bull calf, which will be sold in the market.

Some of the profit will go to Alphonsine and the rest will go to Solace, one of our Rwandan partners to put into their Community Lending Program.

Student Sponsorship Success

This past June Eric Habinshuti received his Bachelor's of Business Administration and Marketing from a Kigali university making him the first INSPIRE!africa sponsored student to successfully complete his post-secondary education.

Eric had been taking classes at the Rwanda Multi Learning Center when he first learned of the sponsorship program and was overjoyed when he found out he would be sponsored to complete his education. Eric comes from a very large family, with three brothers and two sisters, and it was not possible for Eric's parents to support any further education.

Over the past three years, as Eric has been working on his degree, he has been teaching English and helping out with the accounting at the Rwanda Multi Learning Center. Through Eric we are seeing the direct benefit of the sponsorship program as he imparts his knowledge on to others and has been able to pay for all of his siblings to attend primary and secondary school.
